The role of vice-president requires approximately 12 hours per week. Of this, 4 hours are dedicated to participating in and following up on the meetings of the Executive Board, which you chair in the absence of the president. Additionally, you ensure good communication throughout the week and remain accessible. As vice-president, you also participate in many meetings within our university.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF YOU?

You stand alongside the president of the Student Council, serving as their right-hand and left-hand person. You take responsibility, delegate tasks, and communicate efficiently with other board members. You manage and respond to emails, attend meetings, and meticulously follow up on all tasks within the Student Council. When necessary, you chair meetings of the Student Council and ensure smooth proceedings. You handle confidential information with care. While you are comfortable in the spotlight, you don't mind working behind the scenes to get things done. As vice-president, you are also a Student Director within Odisee. This means that you, along with your president, sit on the governing body of the organization. The governing body discusses all measures aimed at realizing the mission of the university and ensures its continuity.



START CANDIDACY TO BECOME A STUDENT REP

To apply for a position within the Executive Board, you must first apply as a Student Representative within Odisee. You can do this by completing the form you receive by email.

MAKE SURE YOU'RE WELL-INFORMED

A board position within the Student Council is a fantastic opportunity! We highly recommend it! However, we advise you to make sure you're well-informed. You can do this by checking the website, sending an email, or reaching out to a current board member via Teams message. We're here to assist you every step of the way!

START CANDIDACY TO BECOME A BOARD MEMBER

After submitting your candidacy as a Student Rep, you also have the opportunity to put yourself forward for a board position within the Student Council. You can do this by sending your chosen position(s), CV, and motivation letter for the position(s) via email to voorzitter.studentenraadeodisee.be. The exact steps for this are also outlined in the confirmation email you receive after applying as a Student Reps.
